DEADLINE: Monday, October 18, 2021

Eligibility

- -Recipients must be members in good standing of the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) and CPS NL.
- -Recipients must have practiced in Newfoundland and Labrador for a minimum of two years.
- -Recipients must have graduated from an international medical school, outside of Canada, AND must not have completed a Canadian Residency Program.

Criteria

(Must meet one or more of the criteria)

- -Recipients must demonstrate distinguished leadership as members of the community, showing commitment above and beyond the usual responsibilities of a family physician.
- -Recipients must be committed to quality patient care through their leadership, and demonstrate a unique ability to guide and inspire others.
- -Recipients must build strong relationships that support a high level of trust and credibility.
- -Recipients must work effectively with others to enhance various health-related priorities in their communities.
- -Recipients must exhibit a strong commitment to enhancing the understanding and value of the role of family physicians in Newfoundland and Labrador.
